



Sports Funding Planned Expenditure 2020-21

What is Sports Funding?

The Primary PE and Sport Premium 2020 to 2021 is paid by the Secretary of State for Education to academies to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of primary-aged pupils, in the 2019 to 2020 academic year, to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles.

For the Academic year 2020/2021, we expect to receive £17,120 in Sports Funding plus £3630 carry forward from 2019-20 due to Covid. Total: £20,750

Due to COVID there will not be afterschool clubs to avoid mixing bubbles.

Develop the use of computing within PE and games.	Purchase iPads to record activities in lessons to enable children to review and improve their skills. Recordings will be used in school to celebrate achievement and demonstrate high expectations.	£3500	
To encourage physical activity at break times to promote healthy lifestyles.	Purchase breaktime equipment suitable for each class and budget for replacement of items.	£200	
Arrange workshops with specialist coaches in skills children would not usually experience.	Book individual specialists or companies to provide workshops in activities not covered in the curriculum. To provide activities for children who are less confident in PE.	£2520	

Adult support during PE lessons to enable pupils with SEN to access activities.	Teaching assistant support for 3 pupils with SEN who find it difficult to access activities in PE and Games for 2 hours each per week.	38 x 6 hours £3802	
Adult support at break and lunch to engage them in playground activities.	Children with special needs who find it difficult to join in playground games will be supported to do so.	38 x 5 hours £2468
