Sports coach to teach all classes 1 day per week.	<b>£4,560</b>	Complete Sports hosted by Adam Capper to provide high quality, specialist weekly PE lessons for all children in the school.	All classes received lessons in a wide range of activities in PE, competitive sport, including dance. Children reported that they enjoyed lessons and participated fully in activities. Behaviour and attitudes were of high standard. Teachers have benefited from observing the coach and receiving support and advice.
Extra-curricular clubs	<b>£798</b>	Complete Sports will offer before School Clubs and holiday Clubs which will be subsidised.	Early morning club in a range of outdoor activities was run by the sports coach to widen the children's experience and to encourage those who are less motivated in PE.  Gym club, run by a specialist coach has developed skills for a group of children. Pilates club has been popular with children who would not choose competitive sports
Up-date and replace equipment	<b>£1606.84</b>	PE and games will be well resourced to enable high quality lessons to be delivered.	An audit of all PE resources was completed. Equipment for inside and outside use was replaced and additional resources were purchased so that the full PE curriculum can be taught effectively.
First Aid training	<b>£84</b>	First Aid training for Year 5&6 will provide the children with basic skills in emergency situations.  Teaching Assistant to support the activity.	Year 5&6 children received training from an external provider with specialist equipment. They have the confidence and basic skills to know what to do in an emergency.

Adult support during PE lessons to enable pupils with SEN and physical needs to access activities.	<b>38 x 6 hours</b> <b>£3802.16</b>	Teaching assistant support for 3 pupils with SEN who find it difficult to access activities in PE and Games for 2 hours each per week.
